The program offers energy efficiency and DER audits and analysis to provide a customized high-level review of DER options and other sustainability strategies, giving you the information you need to choose the right DERs for your facilities and assets. SoCalREN offers project management support for your DER and energy efficiency projects, including help with incentive applications, assessing and applying for financing, and providing the technical assistance you need to complete your project—all at no-cost.
